

4-H Project- Demonstration (4th and 5th grade ONLY)

GOAL: To practice combining verbal & visual skills to communicate a message.

Share what you've learned with others. Give a demonstration teaching one simple project idea. **What is a demonstration though?** It is a talk that **shows**, one step at a time, how to do something while telling **how** to do it. It is easier than giving a speech because you have visual aids (posters, models, props) while you are talking.

You must pick a 4-H Project area below to give your demonstration on:

- Clothing and Textiles
- Communication/Public Speaking
- Companion Animal (dog, cat, rabbit)
- Computers and Technology
- Consumer Education/Economics
 - Dairy*
 - Electric
- Engineering/Safety Science
 - Entomology
 - Food Science
- Forestry, Wildlife and Fisheries
- Goat*
- Horse*
- Horticulture/Garden
- Leadership/Personal Development
 - Line and Design
- Nutrition, Health and Fitness
- Performing Arts/Recreation
 - Photography
 - Plant Science
 - Poultry*
 - Sheep*
 - Swine*
- Veterinary Science

These are the rules for doing a demonstration:

1. Demonstrations must relate to a 4-H project area as listed above.
2. **Time Limit 1-2 minutes** at the in-school club level.
3. No live animals. Do not bring anything that is not allowed at school.
4. Must be an individual demonstration. No one will help you during your demonstration.
5. If you are chosen, you will go on to the sub-regional contest.
6. No props will be provided. You must bring and set up all the items you need **PRIOR** to beginning your presentation.
