Helpful Hints:

- A demonstration should include visual aids.
 - Examples Tri-Fold Boards, Ingredients, Equipment, Photos, etc.
- Make sure your audience can see you and your visual aids.
- Be very specific when explaining each step of your demonstration.
- Include both an introduction and a conclusion in your presentation.
- Show your finished product.
