Interactive Exhibit Contest

What is an Interactive Exhibit?

Table-top exhibit that:

- Attracts attention
- Focuses on a central idea
- Explains a concept; solves a problem; changes an opinion; teaches something
- Relates to your 4-H project* area in some way
- 4-H members will explain their exhibit in 1-2 minutes to a judge and answer questions!



Rules:

- Must be free-standing (such as a tri-fold board).
- Must fit on 1/2 of a 6 foot table.
- Items can be displayed on the table. Space from the floor to the table can be used.
- Must have a title.
- Can use pictures, diagrams, models, examples, etc.
- Be creative!
- Must have the word 4-H or the clover on it somewhere.
- NO LIVE animals.
- Explanations are given only to judges, therefore information presented on exhibits should be complete. Those attending the contest should be able to observe your exhibit and understand the general idea of your project or display without explanation.

This contest is for Jr. High 4-H members only (Grades 6-8) *Project Areas include: Beef, Citizenship, Clothing/Textiles, Communication, Companion Animals, Computers/Tech, Consumer Education, Arts & Design, Dairy, Electric, Engineering, Beekeeping, Food Science, Forestry/Wildlife, Goat, Horse, Horticulture/Garden, Leadership, Personal Development, Nutrition, Health & Fitness, Performing Arts/ Recreation, Photography, Plant Science, Poultry, Sheep, Swine, and Veterinary Science
